A place in the home dedicated to worshipping a deity

The special texts in Hinduism are called the **Vedas**.

A Hindu place of worship is called a **Mandir.**

Bell—to make a sound so God knows someone has come to worship.

Murti—a statue or picture of a deity.
When looking at a murti Hindu people
believe they are meeting the God.

Incense—a nice smell to clean the air.

Sticky Learning

- Hindu people worship in a **Mandir** or at home.
- Hindu people have a **shrine** at home to use for **worship**.
- In Hinduism, there is one God (**Brahman**) that comes in many forms.
- Each form of God is called a **deity** and is special in a different way.

Tray for Prashad — Hindu people offer blessed food and flowers to the God. This special food is called Prashad.

Diva Lamp—this will be moved around to bring light to the shrine showing God's presence.

Water and spoon—a sign of welcome and respect to God.
In India people welcome someone into a house with water to drink and wash with.
