Sacrifice

Give up something valued for the sake of something or someone else.

Agape

The love of one's fellow humans.

Temptation

The desire to do something. Usually something wrong or unwise.

Self-discipline

Christian love is also known as Agape. It is a sacrificial love.

Christians are expected to make sacrifices for the ones they love.

Romero was a special man, who stood up for poor communities.

He lived and worked in El Salvador. The country was owned by rich families who threatened to kill anyone who complained.

He is remembered for the sacrifices he made and the love he showed.

Even so, Romero spoke out against injustice. On 24th March 1980, Romero was killed whilst delivering a Church Service.
